1. Editorial focus

The Proceedings of the interdisciplinary conference “Women’s narratives and European Integration History” (“the Proceedings”) is the official publication of the international event organized on 20 and 21 April 2023 by and at the University of Luxembourg /Luxembourg Centre for Contemporary and Digital History (C²DH) in connection with the project “The role of women in European and international relations in Luxembourg (after the Second World War)”, developed by the University of Luxembourg, C2DH and Europe Direct at the University of Luxembourg

The articles included “the Proceedings” are those that: foster excellence and originality in research, contribute with new inter- and multidisciplinary insights to theories, methodologies and approaches related to the history of women in Europe in the 20th and 21st centuries, highlights gendered perspectives and issues related to European democracy, rights, policies, institutions and actors, and foster digital methods and tools in developing new knowledge of the past.

We are fully committed to upholding the integrity of the work we publish. We pledge to meet the highest standards in publication ethics, such as those described within the Principles of Transparency and Best Practice in Scholarly Publishing (see more here - <https://oaspa.org/principles-of-transparency-and-best-practice-in-scholarly-publishing-2/>).

2. Open access and publication fees

“The Proceedings” represents an open access publication, which provide immediate open access to its content under the [CC BY 4.0](https://creativecommons.org/licenses/by/4.0/)

The re will be no publication fees.

Authors who publish with these “Proceedings” retain all copyrights and agree to the terms of the above-mentioned CC BY 4.0 license.

3. Publication timeline

The editors of “the Proceedings” accept manuscript submissions until 8 January 2024.

Thereafter, the manuscripts passe through two peer-review processes, and a period necessary for improving the content (2-4 weeks) before obtaining the greenlight for publication.

4. Indexing and abstracting

The papers included in “the Proceedings” will be published by Sciendo (De Gruyter Academic Publishing) in a Conference Proceedings Volume with ISSN and ISBN.

“The Proceedings” will be submitted to various indexing services, including: Baidu Scholar, CNKI Scholar (China National Knowledge Infrastructure), CNPIEC – cnpLINKer, Dimensions DOAJ (Directory of Open Access Journals), EBSCO Discovery Service, EconBiz, Google Scholar, J-Gate JournalTOCs, KESLI-NDSL (Korean National Discovery for Science Leaders), MyScienceWork, Naver Academic, Naviga (Softweco), Primo Central (ExLibris), ProQuest (relevant databases), Publons, QOAM (Quality Open Access Market), ReadCube, Research Papers in Economics (RePEc), Semantic Scholar, Summon (ProQuest), TDNet, WanFang Data, Web of Science - Conference Proceedings Citation Index, WorldCat (OCLC).

5. Formatting your manuscript

Authors should submit their manuscript in the required form (see Authors' Guidelines) before the deadline.

Do not submit a paper which has been published previously or is simultaneously being submitted elsewhere.
